AGAINST CIVIL SERVICE RE-FORM.

The Democratic convention which nominated Mr. Bryan for the presidency did so many eccentric things that the public has hardly had time to consider them all. One of the most important of these is the dec laration which the platform makes against civil service reform. The words read:

"We are opposed to life tenure in the public service. We favor appointments based upon merit, fixed terms of office, and such an adminis tration of the civil service laws as will afford equal opportunities to all citizens of ascertained fitness."

The "ascertained fitness" undoubtedly means political faithfulness and an ability to corral votes.

The demand for civil service re form has been pressed since the administration of President Hayes, who manifested an earnest desire to extend the beneficent scope of its workings. 
