FORMALLY NOTIFIED

Governor Stone Makes the Addresses.

BRYAN, THE BOY ORATOR, REPLIES

He Makes an Eloquent Defense of the Chicago Platform and the Democratic Party.

NEW YORK, Aug. 12 .- William Jenninge Bryan, of Nebraska, and Arthur Sewall, of Maine, were tonight formally notified of their nomination by the Democratic party for the offices of president and vice-president, at a meeting in the big Madison-Square garden, forming a notable political event, and a remarkable climax to the remarkable tour of the continent. An army of unnumbered thousands filled the streets and crowded about the building in the hope of securing admission. In the hall, which was like a fiery furnace, Bryan spoke to 20,000 people for nearly two hours. His address dealt almost entirely with the financial question; was more argumentative and less eloquent than his historic Chicago speech, and only in a closing appeal to the citizens of New York did he speak in the strain in which he bad captured the Chicago convention. 
