Since 1873 we have put in circulation over \$400, 000,000 in silver, or more than 50 times as much as the total coinage previous to 1873, and on the 1st of last month the number of silver dollars was 430,790,041.

"Free coinage of silver will expand our currency."

A law decreeing the free coinage of silver would instantly contract the currency by the total amount of our gold coin (\$567,000,000) going out of circulation, for every one into whose possession gold came would hoard whatever he could save of it, knowing that its value would always remain unchangeable. To supply this instantaneous loss of currency with silver dollars worth in gold 52 cents would require the operation of all the mints in the country night and day for 10 years, during which time a good deal might happen to us.
