That is Mr. Bryan's own interpretation of the Chicago financial plank "If you owe a debt"-which you have contracted on the basis of one hundred cents to the dollar; and which justice and honesty require you to pay on the basis of one hundred cents to the dollar-"you can go out into the market and buy silver"-at the market rate, of course, of 4121 grains for fifty three cents-"and have it coined"-at the rate of 4124 grains to the so-called dollar-"and use that silver to puy your debts"-use, that is, what cost you fifty-three cents to pay a debt of one hundred cents. If that is not repudiating 47 per cent of the debt, what is it? And why should you not go




