



Congress shall regulate the value of the coin it may mint. The constitution nowhere indicates that congress shall, may or can regulate the relative value in case two or more metals are used. Congress has never attempted to do this, although it has several times declared what amount of gold, silver, nickel or copper the respective coins shall contain, and to what extent these coins shall be a lawful tender for the payment of an obligation.

NO STATE shall make anything but gold and silver coin a tender in payment of debts. Congress has the exclusive power to declare what shall te a legal tender. Nothing in the constitution requires congress to make both gold and silver a legal tender. It has frequently declared different kinds of money-gold, silver, nickel, copper and United States notes a legal tender; but the latter were never made a legal tender for any obligations except those to the United States until the Act of February 26, 1862.






