BY A PLURALITY OF 50,000 VOTES

The Largest in the State--Powers is Elected Governor by Over 45,000 Plurality.

Augusta, Me., Sept. 14 .-- Maine has followed the example of Vermont and declared for the Republican ticket by the largest majority in its history. According to the latest returns tonight, the plurality for Powers, Republican, for governor, will be over 45,000, and probably in the neighborhood of 50,000.

Hon. Thomas B. Reed is re-elected to the house by over 10,000 plurality. The returns show a plurality of about 10,000 for Dingley for congressman from the Second district: over 12,000 for Milliken in the Third district, and practically the same for Boutelle in the Fourth district.


