## THATCHER IS CHOSEN

### New York Democrats Name Him for Governor.

#### CONVENTION'S WORK COMPLETED

Fully indorses the Chicago Declaration and Presidential Ticket—Bryan and Sewall.

BUFFALO, Sept. 17.—John Boyd Thatcher, of Albany county, was today nominated by the state Democratic convention for the office of governor. The chief feature of the platform adopted by the convention is its full indorsement of the platform and nominees of the Democratic national convention, held at Chicago last month. Minor features of the platform are denunciation of the Republican state administration, advocacy of the improvement of the roads and condemnation of the Raines liquor law.

BUFFALO, Sept. 17.—After the re-assembling of the Democratic state convention today, business proceeded with expedition. The report of the committee on credentials having been adopted, the committee on permanent organization reported, naming ex-Congressman Hosea H. Rockwell, of Chemung, for permanent chairman. It was greeted with applause. He made an able speech in advocacy of the Chicago platform and ticket.

After Rockwell's speech, the chairman called for a report of the committee on resolutions. It was read by Mr. Yorke. The plank of the platform is as follows:

"The Democratic party of the state of New York, in convention assembled, unreservedly indorses the platform adopted by the Democratic party at the national convention held at Chicago on July 7, 1896, and cordially approves the nominations there made, pledges William J. Bryan and Arthur Sewall its hearty and active support, and declares as its deliberate judgement that never in the history of the Democratic party has a platform been written which embodies more completely the interests of the whole people as distinguished from those who seek legislation for private benefit than that given the country by the National Democratic convention of 1893."

#### PREPARING TO FIGHT.

##### Vigorous Campaign to Be Opened in Cuba.

HAVANA, Sept. 17.—There was much animation in the captain-general's palace yesterday. Captain-General Weyler held a conference with various commanders of columns, also with the commanding officer of marine and the chief of the medical department. These conferences are the precursors of an approaching campaign, which is intended to be vigorous and resolute.

Captain-General Weyler will assume personal command at Pinar del Rio, Abumida and Palmaro, taking charge respectively of military and political affairs at Havana. Among other measures General Weyler thinks of adopting as a prelude to the campaign is the revocation of the edict of pardon, obliging families having connections in the ranks of the insurgents to move into other provinces, and making concentration in villages obligatory, considering all persons found in the country as enemies or supporters of the enemy.

Captain-General Weyler's order recently issued putting line officers in command of regular guerrilla and volunteer forces, is bitterly resented and in consequence thereof many desertions are occurring.

At Sagua la Grand, where Captains Irogren and Quintero, of the regular army, were lately appointed, one-third of the men have disappeared. At Cameronea, a Santa Clara town, the local Spanish guerrilla went over to the enemy in a body a few days ago, and returning with the insurgents, assisted the latter to capture a government fort in the suburbs. They then raided the town, looted stores and ransacked various private residences, seized the local archives and carried off the municipal seal.

mounted Spanish guerrilla force armed with Mauser rifles at the expense of Bayamo merchants, recently went over to the rebels, joining Calixto Garcia. The captain is a nephew of Garcia, and obtained his commission from Martiánez Campos, former captain-general.

According to the latest information Maceo has moved south of his former positions. No steps will be taken to follow him until the commencement of the concerted operations above referred to.

Captains Carrere and Oliverette, of the Sauga la Grand guerrilla forces, who have long been the terror of resident naturalized aliens and native pacificos of that vicinity, have been relieved of their commands and both thrown into a local fortress to await court-martial. Carrere is alleged to have captured and shot prisoners of war, as well as pacificos without the formality of a trial.

#### A Spanish Cruiser Disabled.

KEY WEST, Sept. 17.—Advices last night report the Spanish cruiser Infanta Isabella as disabled at the entrance to Port Havana. She has asked for assistance.

#### The Dog Deserves a Medal.

OAKLAND, Cal., Sept. 17.—That James Feenan, a well borer, who resides alone in a small cottage at Berkeley, was not burned to a crisp last night is due to his pet dog, Dell.

About 2 o'clock in the morning fire broke out in the adjoining room, and the dog by its frantic howls and tugs at the bed clothes awakened its master who was already enrouned by flames. In escaping from the house he was seriously burned. The skin had peeled from various parts of his body. His hair was all gone, and his eyebrows and eyelashes were singed to a crisp. In this pitiable condition he was found near a hillside where he had crawled to get away from the burning building. The little dog that had been scorched in the flames in his efforts to save his master, stood by his side. Feenan was taken to the hospital, and is now in a critical condition.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: By order of the Common Council of Dalles City, made on the 23rd day of September, 1896, and entered of record in the record of Dalles City, on the 4th day of September, 1896, notice is hereby given that the cross walks and sidewalks on the following streets or parts of streets, have been declared dangerous by said Common Council on said 23rd day of September, and the said Common Council will proceed to make the improvements as hereinafter designated on said streets or parts of streets so declared dangerous after 14 days from the first publication of this notice, to-wit: September 10th, 1896; and the costs of such improvements of all cross walks, and of each of them, will be charged and levied upon the corner lots cornering upon the street or streets intersected by such cross walks, and upon all lots or parts thereof, to the center of each block cornering upon such intersection; each lot to pay that portion of the entire cost that its street frontage upon the intersecting streets bears to street frontage of all lots to be assessed upon such streets, and the cost of all sidewalks of each of them respectively, will be charged and levied upon the property adjacent thereto, and directly benefited thereby, as provided by the ordinances and charter of Dalles City. The crosswalks and sidewalks declared dangerous as about to be improved and built are as follows:

1. To build a crosswalk on the south side of Third street across Union street.
2. To build a crosswalk on the South side of Fourth street across Union street.
3. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Fourth street across Union street.
4. To build a crosswalk on the north side of Fourth street across Union street.
5. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Liberty street across Fourth street.
6. To build a crosswalk on the north side of Fourth street across Liberty street.
7. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Liberty street across Third street.
8. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Court street across Seventh street.
9. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Union street across Eighth street.
10. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Laughlin street across Second street.
11. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Washington street across Second street.
12. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Court street across Second street.
13. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Union street across Second street.
14. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Federal street across Second street.
15. To build a crosswalk on the south side of Third street across Second street.
16. To build a crosswalk on the east side of Federal street across Third street.
17. To build a crosswalk on the west side of Union street across Third street.
18. To build a crosswalk on the north side of Second street along lot 8 in block 18.
19. To build a sidewalk along lot 1 on Washington street from alley to Main street, and along lot 1 on Main street, all in block 3 of Dalles City.
20. To build a sidewalk on west side of Federal street along lot 4 in block 1, in Noyce addition to Dalles City.
21. To build a sidewalk on the east side of Case street, from the south side of Fulton street 200 feet south in Fullons addition to Dalles City.
