A Phenomenat Rainfall.

The most phenomenal rainfall recordd in the annals of Ohio took place on the 12th day of August, 1861. Mr. S. B. McMillan, who gives an account of this remarkable downpour, says that it ex-tended over an area of at least 100 square miles. The total amount of water which fell during the 11 hours of precipitation was 81/4 inches, and of that quantity 4.3 inches fell in 41/2 hours. What is meant by a fall of 81/4 inches of rain in so short a space of time will be better understood when the reader is informed that one inch of rain means 22,000 gallons to the aere. This immense quantity of water will weigh 220,000 pounds, or 100
