Much Depended Upon the Supreme Court Decision.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 16 .- Much local interest is felt in the decision of the United States supreme court in the irrigation bonds case, for on it the development of the state greatly depends. About \$8,000,000 of irrigation tonds are held in this vicinity and in Europe. Local banks and capitalists have advanced much money upon the bonds as collateral securities, and a decision that they are valid means the immediate establishment of a strong market value for them, the issuance of more bonds and opening up of vast areas of rich farming lands, which, coupled with the advance in wheat, will make the state more prosperous than ever.

A decree of the supreme court confirming Judge Ross' decision that the bonds were invalid would have meant a loss to the extent of the money invested in them and loaned upon them, and the retarding of the important work of irrigation for a time.

In the irrigation districts directly affected by the decision, the sustaining of have worked a great hardship. Nearly \$5,000,000 has been spent already in building dams, etc., and preparing to irrigate and cultivate 20,000,000 acres. Under the exact provisions of the Wright act, an adverse decision would cause this money to be lost. On the other hand, a favorable decision would cause at least \$15,000,000 more to be spent for improvement purposes.
