"'My client's airship started from Oroville, in Butte county, and flew 65 miles in a straight line, directly over Sacramento. After running up and down once or twice over the capitol, my friend came right on, a distance of another 70 miles, and landed at a shop on this side of the bay, where the machine now lies, guarded by three men.
