Besides the immense stock interests of this section, interests that produce for shipment annually 25,-000 head of cattle, 200,000 sheep, and 8,000,000 pounds of wool; besides these and the 2,000,000 bushels of wheat shipped from Wasco and Sherman counties, the immense amount of fruit, and the great yield of salmon that keeps four canneries running during the season, there is undoubtedly stored up in the ground . An enthusiastic reporter on the right here in the vicinity of our city Oregonian heads a local, "Hail, of untold treasures in the shape of Blessed Chinook!" Portland may coal. 




