THE GLENMORAG.

She Is Working Off the Beach in a Satisfactory Manner.

The Astorian's special correspondent at North Beach sent word Friday afternoon, on authority of Captain Ingram, that the ship Glenmorag then had her head on to sea, was in good position, and that when the tug can pick up the hawser, which is now anchored in the outer break, the shup will come off without any trouble.

On Wednesday the Glenmorag needed only an engine to have been hauled off the sands, and brought in to Astoria by the Traveler. Yesterday's storm made the ship quite lively. She rolled very easily, but was working herself out so much that a stern hawser had to be made fast to the shore. She parted this and another had to be put out. At no time did she thump heavily, but rather rolled. It is thought that the engine will be in place this afternoon, and that the ship will be hauled out to her anchors, and that if the Traveler is there she can be towed into any port, providing the weather is not too stormy. Yesterday morning the surf had moderated a great deal. With only reasonable weather and a tug the Glenmorag will be in Astoria this evening. The Astorian's correspondent says that the ship did not show a sign of leak or strain, and at high tide yesterday rolled as easily as if at sea.
