MAKE CUBA FREE.

The killing of Maceo has stirred America as it has not been stirred since the civil war. CONCERNING SALMON.

A bill was presented to the last legislature, and unfortunately beaten, providing for licensing fishermen. It was proposed to tax gill-nets \$2:50 each, and seines, traps and wheels \$10 each. To this the canners suggested should be added a graded tax on themselves ranging from \$100, according to pack, and averaging about \$200 for each cannery. It was expected that this tax would raise, in round numbers, from \$7,000 to \$9,000. It was intended that this money should be used in paying the

salary of the fish commissioner, \$2,000, and the balance in maintaining a hatchery.

It is now proposed to present substantially the same bill to the coming legislature, and it is sincerely hoped it may pass. It will make the fish-Court, N. Y. City. E.
