Sudden Death of a Juror.

The trial of Mrs. Nellie E. Jones on the charge of pocket-picking has been interrupted by an unusual incident—the death of one of the jurors.

"Last evening, upon adjournment of court," says the Telegram, "Juror F. M. Black went to his home at Hunter's Station in apparently good health.

"At 2 o'clock this morning Mr. Black died. He had been a resident of Mount Tabor for years, and was well known. He was engaged in fruit-raising and farming at one time. His death was a painful shock to the members of his family and his friends, for it was supposed he was in excellent health.

"When the news was brought to the attention of the court this morning there ensued a consultation as to what should be done. The defendant and her counsel were willing to proceed with the trial with eleven jurors, but Judge Stephens objected to this, as it was improper procedure and he could not countenance it.

"To the proposition to draw one more new juror, Mr. Hume, of the counsel for defendant, objected, and as no other agreement could be reached, it was settled by discharging the jury, and the setting of the case for trial January 19th—the second day of the new term."
