It is also quite possible that the American line, owned by the International Navigation Company (now heavily subsidized), which has fully as many ships under a foreign flag as under the American, has taken an interest

in defeating this patriotic proposition. This measure would create activity in shipbuilding and restore the American flag in the Merchant Marine. Every one who favors adequate protection by import duties should favor the policy of discriminating duties, for it will accomplish for American shipping the same grand results to American interests in the ocean carrying trade that protection has given upon land.
