Opportunity was given yesterday for members of the Rainy Day Club to don their shortened skirts, and to make their first appearance on the street in the costume upon which they agreed when they joined the club. The first rainy day in March was the time set by the club for their peaceful crusade in the cause of health.

Without show or ostentation, the wearers of short skirts appeared during the rain. Large and Small Books.
Near the city of Mandalay, Burmah, is to be found the largest book in the world, the famous Kuth Daw. It consists of 729 parts, in the shape of white marble plates. Each plate is protected by a temple of bricks. This enormous volume is written in Pali, and contains 275,250 stanzas. These stanzas form the religious code of the Buddhists. The Kuth Daw is not an ancient production. Buddhist piety prompted its preparation in this century. It was made by command of Mindomin, one of the last kings of Burmah. In marked contrast with the Kuth Daw is a Konversation lexicon published in Berlin, which is the smallest book in the world. The volume is less than half a cubic inch in bulk, although it contains 175,000 words. A microscope specially prepared for the purpose is necessary to enable the reader to peruse this midget of a book.
