ACTIVE VOLCANOES.

Burning Mountains of South and Central Atserica That Do Deadly Work.

The volcano of Abina, in Peru, which for a century and a half had been considered extinct, suddenly awoke from its long sleep the other day and began up to the date of the last report, says a Panama correspondent of the Philadelphin Press.


