ELASSONA, April 10 .- Edhim Pasha, commander-in-chief of the Turkish army, has received orders from Constantinople to cross the frontier of Greece with his forces, should it be proved that the Greek regular troops are among the rive at The Dalles. Travelers may trust invaders. The Turkish troops will conit, as THE CHRONICLE is kept fully in- tinue advancing against the invaders, who will shortly find themselves between three fires.

The telegraph line between here and Janina, the headquarters of the Turkish army, stationed to meet the possible advance of the Greeks from Arta, has been cut, but the service continues via Monsatari. The Greek irregulars crossed the frontier in the night and surprised and burned four Turkish outpost stations. The Turkish troops are advancing toward the point of attack from Diskata, Isippilo and Metzo.


