IN EAST PORTLAND.

Thirty-Four Passengers Thrown Into the Ditch, Three of Whom Are Killed, and All Are Hurt.

PORTLAND, April 27, 1897,-[Special to THE CHRONICLE.]-An electric car on the Mt.
