Bank Cashier Was Brave and the Robbers Came to Grief.

ODELL, Ill., July 20 .- Two men entered the Williams bank and placing a revolver at the head of Cashier Van Buskirk ordered him to throw up his hands and pass over the cash. Van-Buskirk was ready to meet just such an emergency, as he had weapons at his command, which he raised to shoot at the introders. The robbers fled. The cashier at once gave the alarm. People on bicycles, horses, wagons, buggies and afont ran after the robbers, who ran to the east end of the town where they jumped in a buggy driven by two boys. They drove the horse hard until they saw that the pursuers were gaining, when they leaped out of the buggy and made for a corn field. Hundreds of people surrounded the field and after several desperate attempts to get away the miscreants were caught.

PITTSBURG, July 20 .- The miners are arranging for a series of meetings in Pittsburg, McKeesport and other points


in the district to enlist public sympathy in the strike movement. The meetings will be followed by a general appeal for aid. Redstone Miners Are Out.
