Fatal Result of an Encounter With Strikers. SCOTTDALE, Pa., July 31 .- William Cummings, the leader of the nonunion

A NONUMION MAN MILLED.

men brought here by the Scottdale Iron & Steel Company to take the places of strikers, was shot and instantly killed tonight, in front of the Commercial hotel. Cummings and three companions, all nonunion men, encountered a number of strikers as they came from a barroom, and a war of words ensued. Some one fired a revolver, and a dozen shots followed in quick succession. Cummings dropped dead with a bullet in his temple, and his three companions fled to the mill hotly pursued by an angry crowd.
