The Hudson River Tunnel.

New York, Ang. 5 .- The Hudson river tunnel project to connect New York and New Jersey has been revived. Plans are now being perfected to resume construction where it was dropped five years ago. Engineers say that an expenditure of \$1,500,000 will complete the work. Four million dollars had already been spent before the work was abandoned, at which time there were 3916 feet of completed tunnel going east from the shaft in Jersey City. One thousand feet of this distance extends east of the middle of the Hudson river.

An Extra Dividend.

NEW YORK, Aug. 5 .- The Standard Oil trust has declared another dividend of 2 per cent in addition to its regular quarterly dividend of 3 per cent.

The trust's capitalization is over \$100,-000,000, and the dividend will amount to \$5,000,000. The trust's profits to date amount to nearly \$150,000,000, on an average \$10,000,000 a year. The last dividend shows that the trust's profits amount now to over \$20,000,000 a year. Standard Oil stock rose 7 points on the announcement of the dividend.
