Canada's Alien Labor Law.

TORONTO, Ontario, Aug. 5.—Canada has begun to take means to enforce the alien labor law against Americans. Commissioner McCreary is here on business in connection with work on the Crow's Nest Pass railway through the Rocky mountains, and he informed the Canadian Pacific railway authorities that any American laborers engaged for that work should be deported to their own country again.
