THE LARGEST NUGGETS.

W. F. Drake, of Sonora, Tells of Some Huge Gold Chunks.

To the Editor of the San Francisco Call—Sir: I note in yesterday's issue you give Trinity county, Cal., as having unearthed the largest nugget of gold in the world.

1.—The largest piece of gold in the world was taken from Byer & Hatman's gold mining claim, Hill End, New South Wales, Australia, May 10, 1872.

2.—The Welcome was found at Bakery Hill, June 9, 1859. It weighed 184 pounds, 9 ounces, 16 pennyweights, and was worth \$44,356.

3.—The Welcome Stranger nugget was found on Mount Moliagul, February 9, 1869. It weighed 190 pounds and was worth \$45,000.

4.—The Lady Hotham nugget was found in Canadian Gully September 8, 1854. It weighed 98 pounds, 10 ounces and 12 pennyweights. It was sold for \$23,557.

5.—The Leg of Mutton nugget was found at Ballarat January 31, 1853, at a depth of 65 feet. It weighed 134 pounds, 11 ounces. It was sold to the bank for \$32,380.

6.—The Oats & Deison nugget was found at Donnolly in 1880 at the foot of a tree. It weighed 189 pounds and was sold for \$50,000.
