CHASING A FILIBUSTER.

Probable Cause of Firing Off the Florida Coast.

St. Augustine, Fla., Aug. 21. - Last night heavy firing at sea by rapid-fire guns and the rays of the searchlight brought out the people of this city.

The ship, probably a war vessel, could not come nearer than about five miles off shore, and was evidently chasing a light-draught boat, as the flashes came from the starboard gun.

Evangelina Cisneros' Trial.

New York, Aug. 21. - Captain-General Weyler, in a cable dispatch from Havana to the World, denies the report that Evangelina Cisneros, a Cuban girl of 19, a sensational beauty, of gentle breeding and pure life, had been tried and sentenced to imprisonment for two years in the Spanish penal colony at Centa.

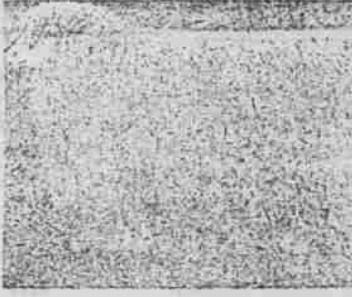
