Lake Chelan, in the Cascade mountains, is the third deepest body of water in the world outside of the ocean. It may take second place, as bottom has deepest body of water on the American in flesh and strength. continent.

These facts have been established by W. G. Steel, now of the United States geological survey and well known as a daring mountain climber and explorer and founder of the well known Alpine club, the Mazamas. Mr. Steel writes as


