Santa Fe Collision the Worst on that Line in Years.

TEN EMPLOYES WERE KILLED

Removal of the Dead and Wounded Accomplished With Difficulty .- W. J. Bryan Tells of His Experience.

EMPORIA, Kan., Sept. 9.-Last night's head-on collision on the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe proves to have been the worst disaster that has occurred on that system in many years. Twelve employes were killed outright or died of their injuries, and fifteen others were more or less injured.

While the rescuers were working to get at the unfortunates, fire broke out in the wreckage of the forward coaches, and a cry for water went up. Water tanks were torn from their tastenings in the coaches that could be entered and blood-besmeared men carried them spreading flames. The dead and mangled bodies of four victims were dragged to the grass beside the track. After herculean efforts the flames were finally subdued, and the work of rescue made

"Some time last September when the Cuban question was so much agitated in the United States, even to the point of furnishing planks to the declarations of presidential conventions, Senor Canovas del Castillo, then premier of Spain, re-ceived assurances from the English and French governments through their representatives in Madrid that they would not permit any action on the part of the United States other than a very perfunctory recognition of belligerency of the insurgents.

On August 5th before leaving Paris, I learned from trustworthy sources that this assurance has been renewed. General Azcarragua, the new premier, has received the French and English ambassadors, who have once more assured Spain of the sympathy of their governments and of their willingness to give "diplomatic help."


