ment of that great newspaper. Mr. Dana had great literary abilties, but it is through the New, York Sun that he is noted and best known to the present generation. In the conduct of his great journal he was the sole responsible editor and controlling manager. He infused into its columns his marked individuality. His sterling integrity to principles, he never forsook; and hence the Sun never descended to the use of the sensational journalism which is so discreditable to the papers of the day.
