A New Foe to American Trees.
Specimens of a strange caterpillar discovered this spring on pear trees in Cambridge, Mass, are pronounced by Prof. Samuel Henshaw to be the "gold tall," or euprotis chrysorrhoea, hither to unknown es an inhubitant of this country, although it is found locally in England, and is "abundant in central and southern Europe." When numerous, these caterpillars are very de structive, feeding on such trees and plants as the apple, pear, plum, haw thorn, bramble, chm, willow, beech, oak, hazelnut and hornbenn. 
