The Wheat Market.

The Portland wheat market is inclined to wobble slightly, and there is a more active selling movement than there has been at any time this season.

While wheat is still hanging at a point that causes operators to do considerable thinking about what the future has in store for the price, just at present the matter of securing ships to handle the big crop is a serious one.

Wheat, in Chicago, was steady at about yesterday's closing price for a few minutes after the opening, and then was subjected to some bearish influences.

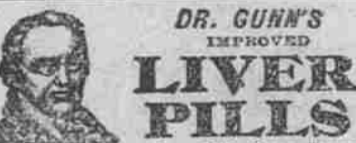
