The September returns of our forchandise exports amounted to \$34,-276,000. This is a phenomenal exhibit. How long it will continue, or whether it has reached its height or not, is impossible to determine. Our exports have been swelled by short crops elsewhere and the consequent foreign demand for our grain and other food products, the higher prices for wheat also being an important factor in the increase.


