of Harvard college, who was hanged in 1850 for the murder of Dr. Parkman, while there was a general conviction that Webster had struck Parkman a fatal blow in a fit of anger, nevertheless the proof that he had deliberately tried to destroy the body of his victum was deemed proof justly convicted and justly executed. But in the case of Hinkle the charge Scott for bis money and burned the body to conceal the crime. There was no suspicion of a quarrel; the accused were either absolutely innocent or absolately guilty of murder and not at all or mansisugater. Therefore, Bare, who is serving crime, and Hinkle, who gets off with fifteen years, as guilty of manslaugter, represent a rery gross miscarriage of
justice, for if there was evidence beyond a doubl that these two men murdered Scott for his money, they wete gunty of a most barbarous
murder and desetved death; and if murder and deserved death; and show beyond a reasonable doubt that they murdered Scott, they should have been acquitted.
