The Wheat Markets.

The Portland local wheat market was a trifle firmer Wednesday in response to the strength exhibited in the Eastern markets.

The shipping season promises to be a long one, and will extend pretty well on toward another year.

Thursday prices for wheat in Portland were: Walla Walla, 80c; bluestem 81 to 82; valley 82 to 83c per bushel.

On Wednesday May wheat was not so eagerly sought for in Chicago as it has been for some days, the consequence being a widening of the spread during the morning to 3 3/8c.

Liverpool closed 1 1/4d higher, which added to the firmness, as did the heavy exports, 619,000 bushels, of which 178,000 bushels was in flour.

The Continental markets ruled lower. Paris wheat declined 5 to 10 centimes, and flour was off 20 to 30 centimes.

Liverpool—Wheat—firm. No. 1 standard California, 28s; cargos off coast; nothing doing; cargos on passage, nominal and unchanged.

Close: Wheat—Spot, No. 1 red Northern spring, new, firm at 7 7/8d.
