THEODORE DURRANT.

In all probability Theodore Durrant was hanged today for the murder of Blanche Lamont in San Francisco in April, 1895. The dispatches show that a final attempt was made yesterday by habeas corpus proceedings to still further delay his execution, but it is not likely that it succeeded. His case, or rather his trial, was a peculiar one. During its progress the newspapers of the city published the full testimony, and their pages were filled with pictures of the murdered girl, the church, the rooms, the clothing, shoes and books of the dead school girl. There were pictures of the witnesses, and every harrowing detail pertaining to the murder was dwelt upon lingeringly and lovingly. He was credited with not only the murder of which he was convicted, but of that of Minnie Williams also, and there all attempt to solve the mystery of her murder was dropped. Yet it does not seem possible that the same persons committed both murders. The murder of Blanche Lamont was accomplished without the shedding of a drop of blood and might be classed as scientific. That of Minnie Williams was brutal and bloody. In the Lamont case every effort was made at concealment; in the other none. In the Lamont case the body was placed where it would decay without attracting attention, the lock of the door leading to the belfry was broken, and it is probable the body would not have been discovered for months but for the subsequent murder of Minnie Williams. It may be possible that both murders were committed by the same person, but it is fair to presume that the murderer of Blanche Lamont, after taking all the steps he did to conceal the murder, would not commit another murder that was sure to bring the first one to light, and this within two weeks of the first.
