FIFTY YEARS AGO.

Marshall's discovery of gold in Sutter's millrace Coloma, Marshall went to California in 1844, served throughout the Bear Flag war, which established the independence of Cal ifornia, and entered the service of its merits earnestly advocated. General John A. Sutter. On January 18, 1848, while superintending the construction of a milirace, he found a nugget of gold. He collected several ounces of the precious metal and took it to Sutter's fort. The news spread like a prairie fire and brought a rush of gold seekers to Coloma, who seized Marshall's carry out any obligations made by their stock and property and divided his land in town lots. It was an unhappy day for him when he detected the gleam of the yellow ore, as it him to poverty.

The claim that Marshall was the first discoverer of gold in California has been disputed, says the Spokesman · Review, with much historic force and evidence. In his fourth annual message to congress, December 5, 1848, President Polk treated Rooms 21 and 22, Tel. 328. at length the rush to the California gold fields. "It was known that mines of the precious metals existed to a considerable extent in California at the time of its acquisition," says that message. Marshall's discovery was made nearly two years after the occupation of California by the military and naval forces of the United States. "Recent discoveries," continues the message, "render it probable that these mines are more extensive and valuable than was anticipated. The accounts of the abundance of gold in that territory are of such an extraordinary character as would scarcely command belief were they not corroborated by the authentic reports of officers in the public service who have visited the mineral district. Reluctant to credit the reports in general circulation as to the quantity of gold, the officer commanding our forces in California visited the mmeral district in July last for the purpose of obtaining accurate information on the subject.

"The effects produced by the discovery of these rich mineral deposits, end the success which has attended the labors of those who have resorted to them, have produced a suprising change in the state of affairs in California. Labor commands an exorbitant price, and all other pursuits but that of searching for the precious metal have been abandoned. Nearly the whole of the male population of the country have gone to the gold districts. Ships arriving on the coast are descried by their crews and their voyages suspended for want of sailors. Our commanding officer there entertains apprehensions that soldiers cannot be kept in the public service without a large increase of pay."

Here is a definite official statement, made in a presidential message to congress, where statements of fact are always weighed with the greatest care, that the existence of gold in California was known prior to Marshall's discovery. Nevertheless it was Marshall's discovery which sent the thrilling news around the world. Speaking exactly, he was not the original discoverer of gold, but practically his was the discovery, and his memory is entitled to the credit.

The Commercial Club acted wisely last evening in deciding to invite the sheep growers to hold a convention in The Dalles. Such a meeting will call attention to the importance of this city as a wool shipping point, and may indirectly lead to the es-


