A recent study of immigration sta－ tistics shows that if further foreign ing off in the number of ime the fall－ ng off in the number of immigration makes any very drastic regulations
unnecessary．
As a matter of fact，since the en－ forcement of the law of March 3 1893，immigration has come to a standstill．In the fiscal year 1894 the total of arrived aliens amounted
