Anti-American Sentiment is General.

WAR DEMANDED BY THE PEOPLE

Stand a Good Chance to Win in Such an Event.

New YORK, Feb. 16 .- A dispatch from Madrid says:

The public feeling here against the United States is very strong. In the public mind the general conviction is that the United States intends to force war upon Spain, and that the latter must absolutely stand her ground; that in courage the landing of American troops ingreat numbers now that the unhealthy season is coming on, as it would kill them off like flies. It would merely be the first step toward the solution of the resources of the country to death. Such is the representative idea of pubic Spanish feeling today.
