## FEELINGS VERY BITTER

Anti-American Sentiment is General.

WAR DEMANDED BY THE PEOPLE

The Spaniards Seem to Think they Stand a Good Chance to Win in Such an Event.

New York, Feb. 16.—A dispatch from Madrid says:

The public feeling here against the United States is very strong. In the public mind the general conviction is that the United States intends to force war upon Spain, and that the latter must absolutely stand her ground; that in Cuba the autonomists will side with Spain, fighting against the United States troops and that the Spanish would encourage the landing of American troops in great numbers now that the unhealthy season is coming on, as it would kill them off like flies. At the same time the ships of war would bombard the coast towns, which with the exception of New York, are considered unprotected, the United States not having enough warships to patrol the entire coast.

At the same time another calculation is made on the widespread ruin which would fall upon business men in the United States, whereas the bourse here would scarcely change as is the case with the United States. It would merely be the first step toward the solution of the question, which is slowly bleeding the resources of the country to death. Such is the representative idea of public Spanish feeling today.

Senor Canelejas declares that his recent visit to the United States and Cuba was not connected with the government. He went solely to learn for himself the condition of affairs. In conclusion he considers Senor de Lome's letter as private and confidential.

The action of the government did not popularize it at home. There are indications that the ministers are not displeased to be rid of a representative who could not sincerely reflect their feelings, for Senor de Lome was a fervent member of the national party, headed by Robledo and Weyler. The government feels relieved now at having one of its own men at the post, who truly represents the most liberal ideas of the cabinet.

The government organ, El Correo, says of the letter:

"It gives the Spanish government offense far exceeding that to the president of the United States. Against the unjudicious words as to the president, we deplore the imputation against the Spanish government and resent it exceedingly. It is deplorable that a public functionary, invested with a diplomatic character, could write, even in a private letter, ideas which are so disgraceful as those from the pen of the late minister to Washington."

El Heraldo says: "The Spanish government has nothing to do with the letter. It did not inspire a single paragraph and had no idea of its existence."

El Heraldo refers to the almost continuous claim that the United States keeps bringing against Spain, and says that this reflects public opinion that the United States wants to force a war upon Spain. This view is taken on 'change, where there are general declines. The government has no easy time.

QUAKUNA, Wis., Feb. 16.—The deal by which the great water power at Quinnesec and the paper and pulp mills, with 1000 acres of land, passed from the hands of the Quinnesec Falls Paper Company to the Kimberly & Clark Company, will be consummated this week. The figures are placed at about \$300,000. The falls are a natural waterfall and dam, with a fall of six feet, making it one of the best powers in the world.
