

The keel of the ship has been found in two pieces the nearest ends of which are separated by a distance of from two and one-half to three feet. The sections are no longer lying in one straight line, but show the effect of a force executed from port to starboard.

It is evident from the discovery of the present condition of the keel that the section of the bottom found twenty-five fietet from its natural position was wrenched from its belt by the first explosion and driven upward. The keel itself was forced in the middle until it
