ITS SILENCE MAUDLINING.

One Feature of Alaska Which Distresses the White Man.
Father Barnum, who is in charge of the Catholic missions in Alaska, returned several months ago for a visit to a civilized community. Next to the cold he found the extreme silence to cause the greatest suffering to white men. There were the white plains stretching off to the horizon, and no bird nor beast is seen; where a footfall is hushed in the snow the stillness becomes almost intolerable at times. The natives are good natured and welcome instruction. While teaching them what he could, the father endeavored in turn to learn something of their language, but in this experienced some difficulty. In one instance he desired to learn their designation of an orphan, and while talking to one of their old women, said: "Now, I want you to tell me something," and proceeded to question her. She did not understand, however, and he tried it on another tack. He said: "I have lost my mother, and my father is dead. Now what—" but he was interrupted by a loud wail from the old crone, who wept bitterly, bemoaning the loss of his parents, attempting to console with him. The father did not learn from her what she called an orphan.—Washington Star.

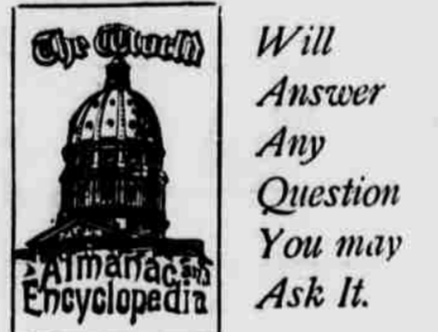
