THE WHEAT MARKET.

A Few Quotations From Various Markets of the World.

The wheat market in this place has been extremely quiet during the past week. Portland exporters have quit bidding and the only demands made at present are by the mills. The prices offered by the buyers at this point is 70c for club and 72c for choice bluestem, while in Portland 75c is offered for Walla Walla and 77c for choice Valley.

CHICAGO—Wheat was very weak at the opening on the 16th inst. The bearish sentiment of the curb of the evening before resulting from the continuance of the remarkably favorable weather prevailing all over wheat sections. The opening price for July ranged from 85 3/4 to 85 1/2 c.

NEW YORK—Wheat, No. 2 red, \$1.03 1/2 f. o. b. aboat; closed at 1/2 c decline. May, 97 3/4 @ 99 1/2 c, closed at 98 3/4 c.
