mand of the army in Cuba, if any force is sent to the island, was one of the most brilliant cavalry officers of the war for the union, and since that time has had experience that admirably fits him for active command in the field.

It is a fortunate circumstance that the commanding general of the army was one of the ablest officers of the graduate of West Point, though in theoretical and practical knowledge of the science and art of war he has no superior among American commanders. His thorough acquaintance with the temper and peculiarities of the United States volunteers will prove to be invaluable in the event of war upon a large scale, for in such a war the volunteer inevitably will be the central figure.




