Spain would thus lose its Cuban base, with no power or opportunity to secure an American base which ized. The Spanish ships would thus be deprived of the means of coaling, unless by tenders accompanying them, which are always liable to de struction or dispersion. We would at once seize some minor seaport on the Cuban coast, communicate with the insurgent forces, which are not less than 40,000 strong, supply them cannon, small arms, ammunition and military supplies of all sorts, and, without the landing of a single American soldier in Cuba, the Span ish army, which depends for its sup port entirely upon provisions imported from abroad, would soon be Medal cigars while the price remains starved into surrender.

"The Spanish army in Cuba today gets rice, beans and flour from Spain ; meat from Mexico and Florida. The city of Havana, with its 200,000 in habitants, gets its milk in condensed form from the United States; its eggs and vegetables from Florida. 


