RAG RUGS.

Instructions for Those Who Cannot Make Them.

Quite satisfactory rugs may be knit or sewn together from rags, but the most durable rag rugs are those woven with warp. Old ingrain carpets, woolen goods of any kind or description may be woven into rugs or carpeting. Excellent rag carpets are also made out of cotton. Cotton carpets of this kind are more durable than those made of wool, and they are lighter. The dust can be shaken out of them more readily, and if necessary they can be put into a wash tub and thoroughly cleaned. They are, therefore, more useful than woolen rag carpets in the kitchen. Cotton rags should be cut about an inch or three-quarters of an inch wide. It makes considerable difference whether they are cut evenly. They may be cut on the bias or straight. Almost every housewife understands how to cut rags for rugs. These special directions are given for "a subscriber" who asked for them: Woolen rags should be cut considerably narrower than cotton. Thinner woolen rags are cut about three-quarters or half an inch wide, heavy coatings narrower, though they must not be so narrow that they will pull apart. Sew rags together firmly. Good linen thread should be used to sew them, or heavy cotton.

Silk rags make very pretty portieres. These curtains are woven with linen warp, and the weaver who provides this warp will charge about 65 cents a yard for his material and work. In a very short time scraps of ribbons, neckties and old silk gowns accumulate. They can be cut into rags about the width of cotton and the pounds grow. It requires about five pounds of silk rags to make a curtain a yard and a half wide by three and a half long. White ribbon and silks of light colors work in well in the "hit and miss" patterns in which the curtains are woven.—N. Y. Tribune.

The First Royal Woman Doctor.

Marie Amelie, of Portugal, enjoys the distinction of being the first woman of royal birth who has acquired the honorable right to add the letters M. D. to the "Regina" that follows her name. After a couple of years of hard and serious study, pursued under disadvantages of no ordinary character, since every moment of a queen's time is supposed to belong to the nation, and to be taken up by the manifold duties pertaining to her lofty station, she has just succeeded in passing with flying colors the difficult examination which entitles her to practice as a physician. Emperors, queens and princesses of the blood have on many occasions distinguished themselves in connection with the nursing of sick and wounded, as well as with the organization and management of hospitals; but Marie Amelie, the daughter of the late Comte de Paris, is the first lady born to the purple to become actually a full-fledged doctor of medicine.—Philadelphia Press.

Cheese Eggs.

To make cheese eggs boil an egg till hard and remove the shell. Carefully cut off one end with a sharp knife, scoop out the yolk; chop it fine and mix it with a little pepper, salt, grated cheese and vinegar. Stuff the whites with this paste. For forced eggs boil an egg ten minutes and carefully remove the shell. Cut in half, remove the yolk, mix it well with an equal quantity of butter and anchovy paste, and add a touch of cayenne pepper. Fill the egg with the well-mixed paste and put the two halves together.—Pittsburgh Dispatch.
