While the attention of the world is being absorbed in the possibility of a clash of arms between America and Spain, we are apt to forget that the greatest living statesman of the nineteenth century is nearing the line which divides the living from the dead. W. E. Gladstone is dying in England, and in a few days probably will have taken his place in his tory. Under any circumstances Gladstone's death will call for the attention and comment of the world He has been an attractive personality, and represents much of the better order of things in English polities. His life has been nearly coterminous with the century, and he has had a great part to play in all the important transactions of European state

craft. He will pass to his rest honored as few men are.






