TROOPS MAY LEAVE FOR CUBA TOMORROW

Matanzas to Be Made the Objective Point of the Expedition.

New York, May 2.—A special to the World from Tampa, Fla., says:

A rumor is in circulation here to the effect that 5000 troops and as many Cubans as the Cuban junta can gather here will leave Tuesday night for Matanzas for the invasion of Cuba. The World correspondent's informant says that an army officer told him that he had seen an order from the secretary of war ordered the troops to move Tuesday, Matanzas being their objective point. The transports are expected Tuesday.

It is known that of the 30-days' rations given out a few days ago, none is being used, and the regimental officers have received word to have their commands ready to move at a moment's notice. It is known that the batteries have been served out with 300 rounds each, and all soldiers have full cartridge belts.
