The Killing of Melvin Green.

Some additional particulars of the killing of Melvin Green in the Blue Mountain Eagle are given by the Fossil Journal. The Journal says that Sam Maffy A Morrow county boy, J. F. Grable, fired three shots at Green, one of which nome to his parents that he had the the breast. One Bowman, who was with Green, assisted him into the house and left him there, at Green's request, to go out after a horse. Green then was in no apparent danger of dying soon. Before going Bowman, who had Green's pistol, handed it to the wounded man.

When Bowman returned half an hour later, Green was lying outside of the house dead, with his pistol by his side, This bullet entered over his right ear and ranged downward, going out under the lower jaw. The pistol had been held so close to the head that the powder had burned his hair. Maffy had gone to his house, several hundred yards away, before Bowman left, and the officials are puzzled to know whether Green shot himself or Maffy returned and finished his victim.

Hester Green, the father of Melvin Green, is an old and respected citizen of Umatilla county, who has lived 27 years on Birch creek. Green was about 27 years old. He was always inclined to be wild, and had been in various kinds
