isbury succeeded him as prime minister, but a year later he came bach

held office until 1892 , when Gladstone formed another ministry and drove his Irish home rule bill through was rejected by the house of lords, and Gladstone was not strong enough with the country to force the lords In 1894 be resigned the formal leadersupp of the liberal party, placed the rems of governder ine hands of Lord Rosehery, and retired to
private life. His great work was ended, and thenceforth until the end he passed the few remaining years in well-eanned repose, though maintaining to the last a keen and advis-
ory interest in the great affairs of England and the world.
