TORPEDO-BOATS.

With Spain's navy practically annihilated it looks as if the naval engagements of the war were over and that the war would come to an end without a single torpedo having been launched from either side.

We have had no use for torpedoof the torpedo. The Spaniards have not been able to use their columniates and a GUNNING & HOOMER'S boats, because our guns did their torpedo-boats, because our drill and discipline rendered impossible that sudden surprise which is necessary to get in an effective torpedo-shot.

The destruction of the Blano Encalada by a torpedo in the harbor of Valparaiso in 1891 undoubtedly created a strong impression of the effectiveness of these destroyers. But the Blanco Encalada was taken wholly by surprise, and stupidity allowed two hostile torpedo boats to come within fifty yards of her and to launch two or three torpedoes before succeeding in blowing her up.

Such an incident does not prove 7 the effectiveness of the torpedo-boat. It merely proves the incompetence of the Chilian commander. would be absurd to expect any other commander to be caught in the same way, and an offensive armament which depends for its success wholly on the gross incompetence of the enemy cannot expect to be rated highly.
