Terrible Condition of Affairs Reported in Havana ... Sufferings of the Reconcentrados Worse Than Ever.

NEW YORK, Aug. 4 .- A passenger who reached Sagua from Havana says affairs Governor Moody was a passenger last in the capital are growing worse. He said :




